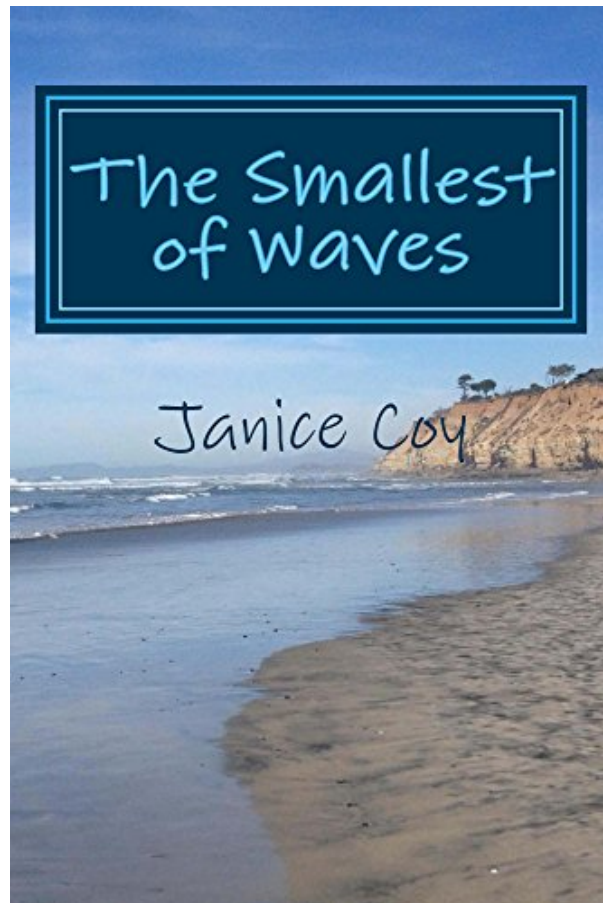
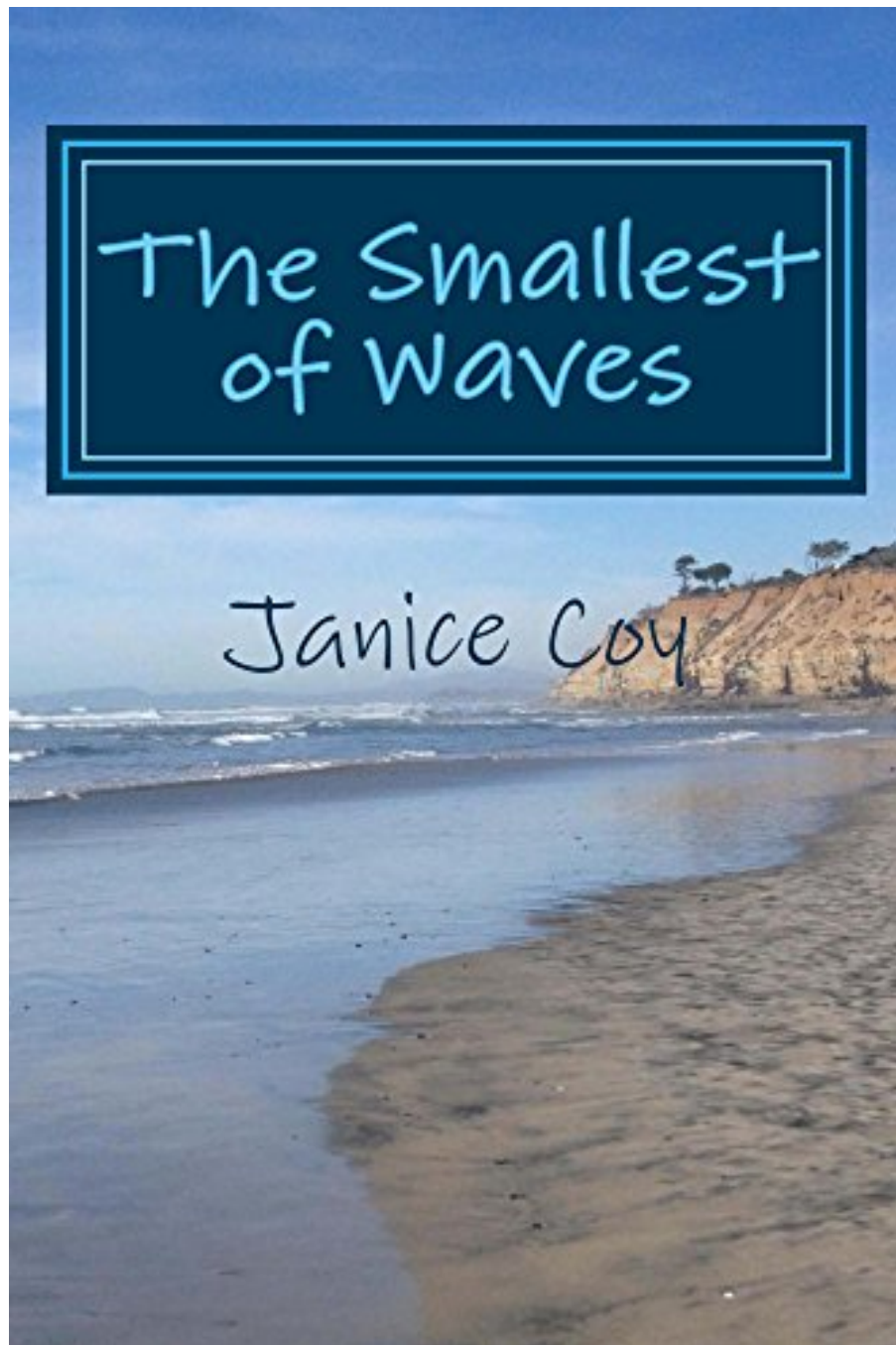


THE SMALLEST OF WAVES BY JANICE COY
